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KBOR Update

Organizational and Leadership Changes



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H.R. 2353 Strengthening Career & Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V) (FY18-FY23)

- State Autonomy – limits Secretary of Education authority.
- Align program performance standards w/ESSA & WIOA
- Competitive funding stream – *innovative* partnerships and practices (State Reserve)
- SAPPs would be included in eligibility (& for financial aid)
- Eliminates performance target negotiation process
- Retention & employment combined into one measure

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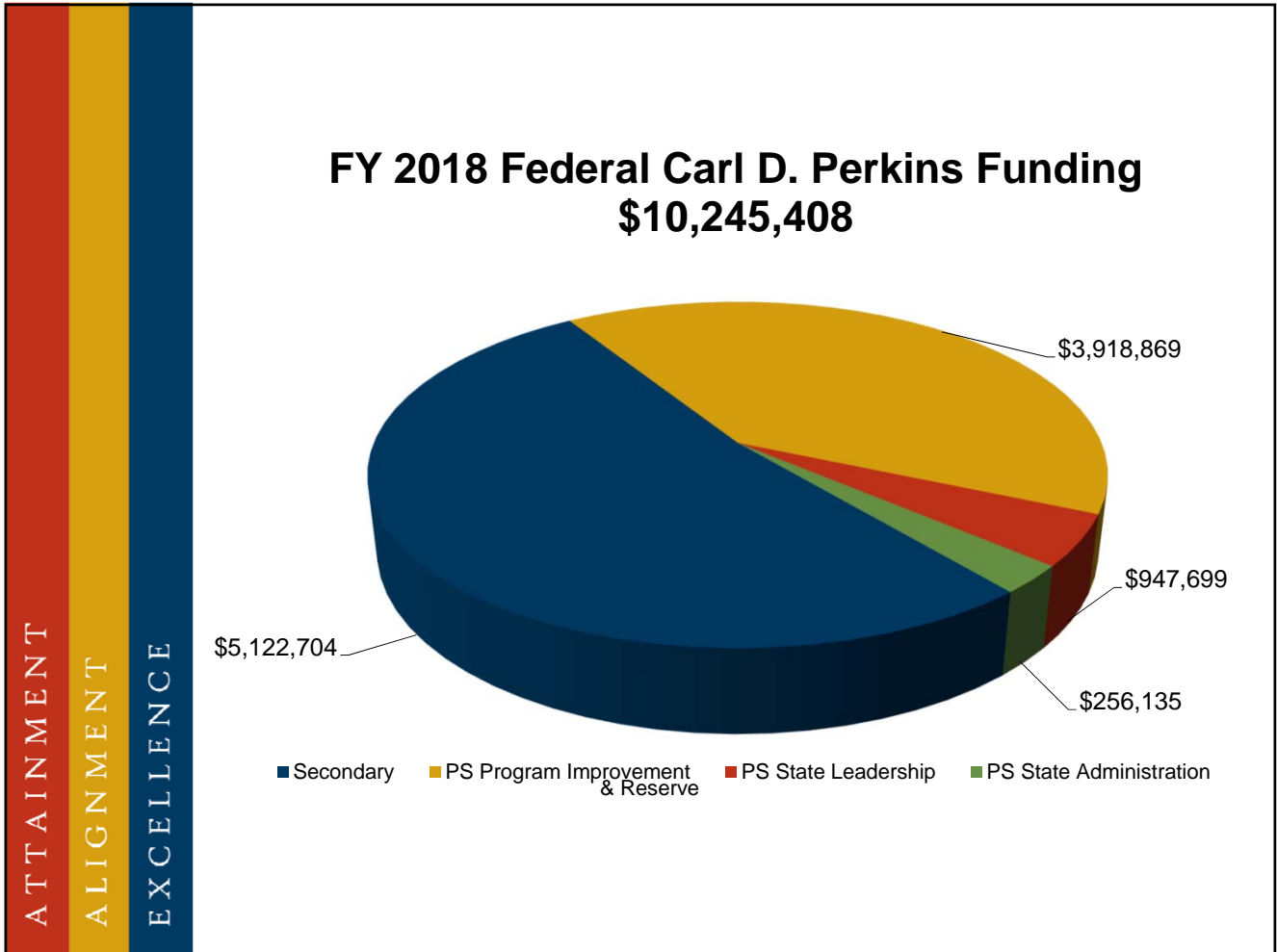
- Size, scope, quality: Six new “required” activities:
 - Provide career exploration and career development activities through organized, systematic framework
 - Provide PD for staff
 - Provide CTE students (& special pops) skills to pursue high-demand, high-wage occupations
 - Support integration of academic skills into CTE programs
 - Support implementation of POS
 - Develop and implement evaluations of the activities funded by Perkins
- New Innovation Grant Funding program

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Military Articulation Initiative

Multi State Collaborative on Military Credit
(Subgroup of Midwest Higher Education Compact)

- Group of 13 states
- Collaborative received a combined \$1.6 million from Lumina and USA funds to support creation of short-term bridge programs, with a focus on healthcare programs
- Driven by Kansas Board of Regents Goal
 - The Board will further the implementation of Credit for Prior Learning in Kansas by aligning with additional branches of the military with a focus on healthcare bridge programs.

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Development of Military Articulation Portal

- Supports web-based military articulation website dynamically
- Automate review and approval process for military articulations
- Create internal portal for uploading articulations
- Create a synergy among institutions among institutions for articulating military programs through workflow strategies

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Kansas Nursing Initiative Grant

- \$1.8 million allocated by Kansas Legislature
- Focus on nursing faculty and supplies
- Recommendations for awards to KBOR Fiscal Affairs & Audit, and to full KBOR for approval this month
- Awards to be made July 1, 2017.
- RFP's done yearly

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Review of Special Collections

- Excel in CTE Initiative (*commonly referred to as SB155*)

The state-funded program covers CTE students' tuition costs for CTE courses taken at any of Kansas's two-year postsecondary institutions.

- AO-K Proviso

Tuition reimbursement program funded by the legislative appropriations to encourage institutions to work with those without a high school diploma or equivalent.

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Review of Special Collections

- AO-K TANF

Scholarship program funded through a partnership with the Department for Children and Families that pays the full composite rate for all courses in approved AO-K pathways.

- GED Accelerator

Incentive program funded by the legislative appropriations to reward institutions for assisting students to concurrently achieve a GED® certificate and an industry recognized credential.

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Kansas Regent Shared Number

- Kansas Core Outcome Groups (KCOG)
 - KS Core Outcomes Project started in 1999 by the KS Council of Instructional Administrators (KCIA) with the goal of developing core outcomes and competencies for general education courses at state universities.
 - Faculty led, discipline specific groups meet annually to confirm or articulate learning outcomes and discuss courses for inclusion in the Kansas System wide Transfer process.

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Kansas Regent Shared Number

- Transfer and Articulation Council (TAAC)
 - Mission is to create structures and processes that facilitate student transfer and degree completion within Kansas higher education. The committee shall:
 - Charge KCOG with developing specific courses
 - Adjudicate disagreement from the KCOG groups
 - Provide final recommendation of system-wide transfer courses
 - Assure quality and adherence to the agreed upon learning outcomes
 - Review proposed revisions to Board policies and bring forth issues and trends affecting transfer and articulation

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Regent Newton's Campus Visits

- New Program Approvals

1. The approval process takes too long

- Process Review Committee

Charge: Examine the approval process to determine areas that may be shortened or eliminated.

- Program Approval Committee

Charge: Determine criteria for approving and evaluating existing programs

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Regent Newton's Campus Visits

- Data Collections

1. Burdensome on smaller institutions
2. Field would like dialog prior to collections being changed

- Data Process Review Committee

Charge: Examine data collections for areas that may be condensed or eliminated.
